Position On the right side of Place Risorgimento, for those who turn the back to the lake, in a flower bed of gravel **Paving material** gravel

Description

The **monument to Giuseppe Garibaldi** was inaugurated on the 20. September of 1907, anniversary of the Capture of Rom on behalf of the Italian Army in order to celebrate 100 years of the birth of the hero of the 2 worlds and to remind the fighters for the Italian Independence. The monument with a height of approximately 250 cm was realized by the sculptor Pietro Clerici of Como. It is closed by a low enclosure made of iron and it is constituted by an herm, laying above a double plain, ending up with the head of an hard woman which represents the freedom. This head has a head gear with a 5 point star, the personification of the Italian armed forces. Below stands out a bronze medallion with the portrait of Garibaldi. The first place was in a flower bed in front of the Peer entrance; in 1923 it was moved. In 1919 to the original structure were added 2 plaques. One in order to remind the dead of the 1st World War and the other one was added on the 25th april 1995 during the 50th anniversary of the liberation.
